Excerpt: . . . and took a census of the white population, which was ascertained to be 6, 000. The enumeration was confined to the whites, because 1854 Census the black and colored population was cared for in the main by their owners. Being immunes also, very few, not exceeding fifteen, perished from the fever. In a medico-statistical sense, this census was of great value in establishing the true rate of mortality.
